<b>Muehlenbeckia australis</b> Pohuehue	Dense tangled mass of small leaves that grows into a shrub form Ideal for coastal areas	2 m	PB3/4	\$ 2.50

<b>Blue grass</b> <i>Festuca gluaca</i>	Prefers full sun to light shade in well drained situation Clump forming fine leaved with blue tinge	25 to 30	PB3/4	\$ 2.50
